Subject	Description
Active Shooter Response	This class will define "Active shooter", cover cases of active shooters, what to do to prevent and respond to an active shooter situation. We break down and discuss RUN, HIDE, FIGHT, What information to pass on to 911 and first responders, and what to expect when they arrive on scene.
Advanced Concepts Class	This class covers concepts of pre-assignment training more in depth. Communication, ethics, and professionalism are among the topics, but reading and discussing the Arizona Revised Statutes makes up the bulk of the class.
Alcohol / ID Class	This class will give students knowledge and information about relevant liquor laws and regulations in the state of Arizona. It follows the Arizona Department of Liquor Licenses and Control guidelines giving students the opportunity to learn ways to detect fraudulent and false identification and improve their overall I.D. checking skills.
Bar Account Training	This class equips students with the knowledge of various skills required to be successful in bar and night club accounts.
Barricade Class	This course is designed to test and evaluate student's ability to perform the necessary functions of a guard posted in a stage barricade style post safely.
Baton Class	Impact strike weapon training is taught by a current Arizona Peace Officer Standardized Training (AZPOST) certified instructor in accordance with AZPOST approved syllabus. Curriculum includes justification, tactical considerations, optimal strike zones, and various applications. <b>MUST HAVE</b> <b>TAKEN BASIC AND INTERMEDIATE DT, AND BE SELECTED INTO THE</b> <b>ARMED PROGRAM</b>
BMAP Class	A national program developed by the DHS Office for Bombing Prevention (OBP) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). BMAP outreach materials are distributed by local law enforcement to local businesses to help employees more easily identify homemade explosive precursor chemicals and IED components, and recognize suspicious purchasing behavior that could indicate potential bomb-making activities. <b>MUST TAKE</b> <b>TATT I, II, AND III FIRST</b>

Provides students with a knowledge how to manage a crowd through the presentation of several crowd disaster case studies and a discussion of emergency planning elements, ingress/egress paths, emergency systems, crowd dynamics, crowd movement, and emergency response
Provides students with a knowledge how to supervise crowd managers through the presentation of several crowd disaster case studies and a "big picture" discussion of emergency planning elements, emergency systems, crowd dynamics, crowd movement, and emergency response. MUST HAVE TAKEN CROWD MANAGER
Basic DT is an introduction to defensive tactics taught by a current Arizona Peace Officer Standardized Training (AZPOST) certified instructor in accordance with AZPOST approved syllabus. Curriculum includes instruction on justification for use of force, soft hand techniques, joint locks, and pressure point applications.
Intermediate DT is a follow on to the Basic DT which is also taught by a current Arizona Peace Officer Standardized Training (AZPOST) certified instructor in accordance with AZPOST approved syllabus. Curriculum includes a review of Basic DT topics, team tactics, and take downs. <b>MUST BE LICENSED AND HAVE TAKEN BASIC DT</b>
This class provides select employees with a basic knowledge of vehicle safety and operation within the patrol and event environments. This course requires the student to provide a clean 39 month driving record.
This multi-faceted class is taught by an American Red Cross certified instructor; students are instructed in Adult, Child, and Infant First Aid, CPR and AED usage.
This class discusses the various facets of conducting searches. Topics include 4th Ammendment, reasons for searches, consent, types of
searches, how to perform effective searches, and an introduction to varius forms of screening technology.

Leadership Development	This class is based on the USMC Leadership training. It defines Leadership, discusses the principles of leadership, and identifies the traits of successful leaders. This class is open to anybody, and sets the stage for further growth as a leader.
OC Class	OC class is taught by a current Arizona Peace Officer Standardized Training (AZPOST) certified instructor in accordance with AZPOST approved syllabus. Curriculum includes introduction to chemical composition, justifications, tactical considerations, and decontamination. Students are encouraged to volunteer to be exposed so the effects of chemical spray are understood. <b>MUST HAVE TAKEN BASIC AND INTERMEDIATE DT</b>
Patrol Vehicle Certification	This class provides select employees with a basic knowledge of vehicle safety and operation within the patrol and event environments. This course requires the student to provide a clean 39 month driving record.
Radio Class	This class is designed to provide employees with the knowledge to operate two-way radios utilizing T.E.A.M. security codes, equipment and procedures.
Report Writing Class	This class is designed to provide employees with the knowledge to operate two-way radios utilizing T.E.A.M. security codes, equipment and procedures.
Situational Awareness Class	Developed to teach employees the skill needed to maintain a heightened awareness of their surroundings and situation. Topics covered include the Cooper color code, the combat mind set, field investigations, team situational awareness, tactics and communications.

TASER Class	This class is taught to TASER International training standards in accordance with the most current version of the user training guidelines provided by TASER International. Classes are taught by TASER certified Professional Security Instructors. <b>MUST HAVE TAKEN BASIC DT, INTERMEDIATE DT, AND HANDCUFFS</b>
TATT Phase I	Developed by the University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), this class covers the basic history of warfare and Revolutions in Military Affairs (RMA), the Frontline Responder roles and responsibilities, and Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) delivery options (CBRNE).

TATT Phase II	Developed by the University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV) and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), this class covers introduction to Improvised Explosive Devices (IED), suspicious person indicators, and suspicious vehicle indicators. <b>MUST TAKE PHASE I FIRST.</b>
TATT Phase III	Developed by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), this class covers IED awareness, and an introduction to Home Made Explosives (HME). <b>MUST TAKE PHASE I AND II FIRST</b>
