4th. A good hat. We will issue you black truckers cap with logo or get yourself a hat (Sorry, no logos).

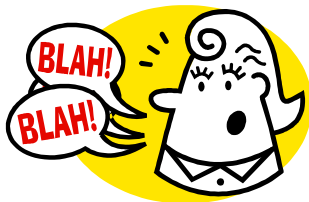
5th. Know how to recognize signs of dehydration. Haven't gone to the bathroom in 8 hours? Could be a clue.
